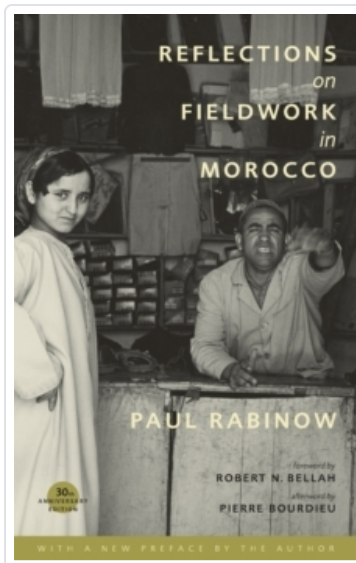


## Reflections on Fieldwork in Morocco
